This Indenture, made the 28th day of October 1850 between Henry Whitehead and
Dolly his wife of the one part and Harrison S. Moore of the other part,
Witnesseth that the said Henry Whitehead and his wife in consideration of
one hundred and Twelve Dollars and 75 cents to them in hand paid by the said
Harrison S. Moore at or before the executing and delivery of these presents
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) Have bargained and sold,
and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto
the said Harrison S. Moore his heirs and assigns a certain tract or
parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded
as follows, to wit: Beginning at a water oak standing in the line of James
Whitehead's et al., thence 54⁰ W. 29 poles to a small sugar gum thence east
16 poles to a pine, thence 57⁰ 5' 6" 17 poles to a white oak side line, thence N.
83⁰ 6' 24⁰ poles to a ditch, thence along the ditch S. 24⁰ 6' 37⁰ poles,
thence along a line of marked trees S. 80⁰ 4' W. 28 poles to a pine standing on
path, thence on the South side of the path N. 66⁰ W. 44 poles, thence 80⁰ 4'
W. 12 poles to a lightwood stump, thence S. 28⁰ 4' W. 17 poles to a pine thence
S. 19⁰ W. 34 poles to a small pine, thence S. 24⁰ W. 29 poles to a black gum
standing in said John M. Gurley's line, a new corner for Harrison S. Moore and
Mrs. Gurley, thence along said Gurley line to an ash a corner for Mrs.
M. Gurley, thence along Harrison S. Moore's line to a pine a corner for
said Moore, thence to a pine a corner for James Whitehead's et al. in Edmund
Willison's line, thence along the line of said et al. of James Whitehead to the
beginning, containing seventy three acres by recent survey, together with
all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging. To Have and To
Hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the said Harrison S. Moore
his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Henry Whitehead and Dolly
his wife, for themselves and their heirs, the said tract of land, with all
and singular the appurtenances, before mentioned unto the said Harrison S.
Moore his heirs and assigns, free from the claim or claims of them the said
Henry Whitehead and Dolly his wife, or either of their heirs and of all
and every person or persons whatsoever, shall, will and do warrant and for-
ever defend by these presents.
