For Acknowledgment made the day of 1850, between Henry Whitehead and Dolly his wife of the one part and John M. Gurley of the other part. Witnesseth, That the said Henry Whitehead and wife in consideration of Eighty seven Dollars and 25 cents to them in hand paid by the 1st John M. Gurley at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto John M. Gurley his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a water oak standing in the line of James Whitehead's lot thence S. 42° W. 29 poles to a small sweet gum, thence east 18 poles to a pine, thence S. 76° E. 17 poles to a white oak (side line) thence S. 83° E. 24½ poles to a ditch, thence along the ditch S. 24° E. 37½ poles, thence along a line of marked trees S. 60° E. W. 28 poles to a pine standing on path, thence on the south side of the path N. 66° 44 poles, thence S. 84° W. 12 poles to a light wood stump, thence S. 28° W. 17 poles to a pine, thence S. 19° W. 34 poles to a small pine, thence S. 24° W. 29 poles to a black gum standing in said Gurley line, a new corner for for Harrison C. Moore and Jno. M. Gurley, thence along said Gurley's line to a post oak a corner for Henry Turner, thence along said Turner's line to a pine a corner for James Whitehead's Estate, thence along the line of the said James Whitehead's estate to the beginning, containing fifty six and a half acres by a. cent survey, together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging. To Have and To Hold, the said tract or parcel of land unto the said John M. Gurley his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Henry Whitehead and Dolly his wife for themselves and their heirs, the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John M. Gurley his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of the said Henry Whitehead and Dolly his wife or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall, will and do acquit, and forever defend by these presents.
