This Deed was made and entered into the 29th day of November 1850, between James A. Gillette and Ann C. Gillette his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one part and Joseph C. Gillette of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, witnesses, that for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and twenty five dollars good and lawful money to the said James A. Gillette and Ann C. Gillette his wife in hand paid by the said Joseph C. Gillette, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged then the said James A. Gillette and Ann C. Gillette his wife have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Joseph C. Gillette his heirs and assigns all that messuage and tract of land situated, lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia containing Three hundred and twenty five acres be the same more or less, and also all trees, woods, and underwoods, ways, watercourses, houses, outhouses, advantages, husbandments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said messuage & above mentioned, belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainments and remainders, rents, issues and profits of the said premises and every part and parcel thereof and all the estate right, title, interest, claim and demands whatsoever of them the said James A. Gillette and Ann C. Gillette his wife, of, in and to the said messuage and premises, it being a tract or parcel of land bounded as follows: Beginning in the centre of the road leading from Monroe to Old Blawie Water Bridge a corner between Peter Goodman and James D. Mapentung, and running thence nearly west along the line of the said James D. Mapentung to a cedar a corner tree between the said James D. Mapentung and James W. Murree, thence in the same direction along the line of the said James W. Murree to a Sycamore tree, thence nearly north to a Sycamore tree, thence north east to a Pine a corner on the said James W. Murree, thence north west along the branch to an ash at the junction of two Branches, a corner between the said James W. Murree and Robert E. Dutton, thence due east along the Branch to the junction of two Branches a corner between Robert E. Dutton and Samuel D. Winborn, thence east the Branch to a Sweet Gum, thence nearly south to a Post Oak, a corner on the said Samuel D. Winborn thence nearly east to the center of the road, a corner on Samuel D. Winborn and Peter Goodman, thence nearly south along the road to the place of Beginning: To have and to hold the said messuage and premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Joseph C. Gillette to his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said Joseph C. Gillette his heirs and assigns forever, and the said James A. Gillette and Ann C. Gillette his wife for themselves and their heirs the said messuage and premises and every part thereof against them and their heirs and every person or persons whatsoever to the said Joseph C. Gillette his heirs
