 tween Edwin Williford of the County of Southampton of the first part and Robert H.
 Patton of the County of Shenandoah of the second part, and Robert Patton of the third part, all
 of the State of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said Edwin Williford stands jointly indebted to
 said Robert Patton in the just sum of two hundred and twenty seven dollars & 57
 cents as will more fully appear by referring to a bond bearing date with this
 indenture. Now, therefore to have the above named sum with interest from
 the above date until paid and in further consideration of one dollar to him the said
 Edwin Williford in hand paid by the said Robert H. Patton, the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged, he the said Edwin Williford has granted bargained and
 sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell to said Robert H. Patton
 his heirs or assigns my stock of hogs thirty four in number and their increase
 four head of cattle and increase, eight sheep and their increase one mule four
 feather beds and bedding forty barrels corn four thousand weight haxe fodder,
 and the succeeding crops & interest in public lands one tumble and side cart and
 wheels, four tables, two chests, and one trunk, 8 flag bottom chairs, one loom,
 one harrow, one spinning wheel, for. cross, a set of coopers tools, four planes
 three augers, one hammers, three iron wedges, three axes, six plantation baskets
 one do. still two shot guns, one one day clock, one pr. andirons Tong
 & shovel, one corner cupboard, all my earthenware, consisting of four
 dishes, twelve plates, one set cups & saucers, one castor and snuff, one
 grindstone, three iron pots, two ovens, two chimels, four wooding
 hoes, two grub hoes and one killing hoe, one fike, nets and fishing
 poles, six bushels peas two stands of bees and all my chickens and
 ducks. To have and to hold with all the right and interest of
 the said Edwin Williford herein conveyed or intended to be conveyed
 to him the said Robert H. Patton his heirs & assigns forever.
 upon special trust, nevertheless, that the said Robert H. Patton
 upon being thereto requested by the aforesaid Robert Patton shall proceed

 above named property hereby conveyed or intended to be conveyed,
 after advertising the same in some place in the County of Southampton for
 ten days previous at some public place or store for cash & out of
 the money arising out of or from the said sale in the first place pay
 and satisfy all cost attending said sale as well as the expenses attending
 said conveyance, and then pay off the bond aforesaid with interest,
 and pay the surplus, if any to Andrew B. Patton to satisfy a bond
 which the said Andrew B. Patton holds against the said Edwin Williford.
