This indenture made and entered into this 26<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord  
Christ one thousand eight hundred and fifty between William B. Joyner and  
Sarah his wife of the County of Southampton and parish of Notcham of the  
one part and Matilda Joyner of the other part. Witnesseth that the said  
William B. Joyner and Sarah his wife, for and in consideration of the sum  
of Three dollars per acre current money to him in hand paid by the said Matilda  
Joyner, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold  
and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said  
Matilda Joyner to her and her heirs forever a certain tract or parcel of  
land containing Three acres or the same more or less and bounded as  
follows, to wit: Commencing at a small persimmon tree, corner tree,  
between John Bradshaw, Joseph Lenow and Matilda Joyner's line, thence  
along the said Lenow line to a pine tree. Between Matilda Joyner and  
Joseph Lenow's line thence along a line of marked trees on the said  
Lenow's line to a pine a few rods from between Joseph Lenow, Wm B.  
Joyner and Matilda Joyner's lines, thence along the said Wm B. Joyner's line  
to a pine a few rods from corner tree, thence along the said Wm B. Joyner's  
line a few rods from corner tree to a post oak, thence along the line between  
John Bradshaw, Wm B. Joyner and Matilda Joyner's to the first  
beginning, together with all houses, offices &c whatsoever belonging  
or in any wise appertaining to the said tract or parcel of land and  
premises, to have and to hold the same unto the said Matilda Joyner to her  
and her heirs forever, and the said Wm B. Joyner and Sarah his  
wife do by these presents grant to and with the said Matilda Joyner  
that they will warrant and forever defend all right title, claim or demand
