This Indenture made and entered into on this 14th day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty, between Josiah Vick and Rebecca Vick his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Jacob Porter of the same County and State of the other part; Witnesseth that the said Josiah Vick and Rebecca Vick his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Jacob Porter at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, I have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth grant, bargain and sell unto him the said Jacob Porter his heirs and assigns for ever one certain tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke containing by Survey fifty two acres be the same more or less, exclusive of the rail roads which passes through it, siting the land the said Josiah Vick purchased of his brother James Vick containing 25th acres, the land he purchased of his brother John Vick containing 17th acres and the Dower land of Mrs Lydia Vick containing 9th acres which is subject to her Dower right during her natural life and all of which is bounded by the lands of Selah Ellsworth, Joel Vick, Benjamin T. Barnett and Benj^r E. Barnes; and the said Josiah Vick and Rebecca his wife in consideration of the sum aforesaid have also granted, bargained and sold to him the said Jacob Porter and his heirs and assigns forever one other piece or parcel of land containing three acres more or less adjoining the lands of Selah Ellsworth, William Vick and Benjamin E. Barnes, which is also subject to the Dower right of the said Mrs. Lydia Vick during her natural life. To have and to hold the two above described tracts or parcels of land and premises, with all and singular the appertinances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining (except the Dower right aforesaid) unto him the said Jacob Porter his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him, the said Jacob Porter his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Josiah Vick and Rebecca his wife, for themselves, their heirs, executors and assigns, do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Jacob Porter his heirs, executors and assigns, that they will by these presents warrant and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid two tracts or parcels of land and premises (except the Dower right as aforesaid, against the claims or demands of all and every third person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof, the said Josiah Vick and Rebecca
