Magett at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof of is held & known) we have given and granted now by these presents do give and grant unto the said Edridge C. Magett his executors administrators and assigns all that certain tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances situated lying and being on the north side of the flat summit in the County aforesaid containing three hundred and thirty three acres be the same more or less, reserving one acre for buying ground and bound as follows: By the Lord of Henry More, Henry Pollock, Henry Cook, who intermarry with Martha Murrell, and the lands belonging to the estate of Nathaniel Francis and Miss the following slaves, Robert, Hannah, Emma, Robert, Harriet and Washington, also their future increase. To have and to hold the said three hundred and thirty three acres of land, together with the slaves aforesaid and their future increase to the proper use and behoof him the said Edridge C. Magett his executors administrators and assigns forever. And the said John M. Neal and Dolly his wife do for themselves their executors and administrators the said three hundred and thirty three acres of land
