The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have lawfully sold and conveyed unto the said
Courtney Wallace her heirs and assigns a certain lot of Land supposed to contain
five acres more or less lying immediately on the South side of the Potomac River
near the bridge on which lot are situated several small houses and bounded
by the lands of said Blom & Charles Tark, beginning at a Post oak near
the road and running down said road to the embankment to a beach thence
along the Longwood to high water mark to a white oak up the hill of said
Longwood and running from thence to a corner pine, and thence to the road
said Post oak, together with all and singular the premises & appurtenances
thereto belonging. To have and hold the said lot of Land unto the said
Courtney Wallace her heirs and assigns forever. And the said Henry Blom
for himself his heirs and assigns do hereby warrant and prove defend the
right and title of the aforesaid lot of Land against the claim or claims of all
and every person persons claiming by through or under him unto the said
Courtney Wallace her heirs and assigns forever.
