This instrument made & entered into this ninth day of December eighteen hundred & fifty
between Jazwell Taylor commissioner as hereinbefore mentioned of the first part and Levi W. Story
Emilia Whitfield Martha Ann Pope and Eliza Rebecca Jane Story heirs at Law of
Jashens Story deceased, late of Southampton County Virginia of the second part.
Witnesseth that whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court of Law & Chancery for the
County of Southampton pronounced on the 10th day of November 1848 in a certain suit
therein pending between Henry J. Smith in his own right & as administrator of Lewis
H. Bishop deceased Plaintiff & John M. Kelly Executor of William A. Sparks dec^d
who was Executor of Clement Rockelle deceased & others as Defendants it was adjudged
ordered and decreed that Richard A. Camp, who was thereby appointed Commissioner
for that purpose should sell at public auction certain lands therein mentioned of which
Clement Rockelle died seized after giving notice as therein required of the time and
place of sale. And whereas the said Richard A. Camp in pursuance of said decree
did before to said the Court of said Clement Rockelle, thereby authorized to be sold on
the 17th day of February 1849, at which sale the said Jashens Story became the
purchaser of the tract of land hereinafter particularly described and paid in cash
to said Commissioner the sum of Seven Dollars and eighty cents his Bond payable to said
Richard A. Camp Commissioner at twelve months after date for the sum of one
hundred and forty five dollars & twenty cents being the residue of the purchase money
said land with John E. Beale and Thomas B. Howell as sureties which said
Bond was returned by the said Commissioner to said Court, with his report of
sale. And whereas by another decree pronounced by said Court in the same
cause on the 8th day of November 1849, the sale so made by the said Richard A. Camp
as Commissioner was confirmed & it was then & there decreed that the said Jazwell
Taylor Attorney for the Specialty Estates of Clement Rockelle deceased, who had
proved their claims before the Court in said cause should receive from the
Clerk of the Court the said Bond with the other Bonds returned by said
Commissioner and should collect the same and upon payment thereof
the said Jazwell Taylor was by said last mentioned decree appointed a
Special Commissioner to execute & deliver to the respective purchasers of
the lands sold as aforesaid by said Richard A. Camp as Commissioner proper
deeds for the land so purchased by them, all which will more fully appear
by reference to the said decrees and proceedings in said suit now remaining of
record in said Court. And whereas before the payment of the said Bond
the said Jashens Story departed this life and John E. Beale administrator
with the will annexed of the said Jashens Story deceased paid to the said
Jazwell Taylor Commissioner as aforesaid on the 18th day of February 1850
the sum of one hundred and forty four dollars and twenty cents in full of the
Bond aforesaid of the said Jashens Story, which payment is hereby acknowledged
by the said Jazwell Taylor Commissioner as aforesaid, and whereas no deed
for the said land so purchased by the said Story was then executed by the
said Commissioner in consequence of the death of the said Story, and whereas
upon a report made to said Court by the said Jazwell Taylor of the
payment of the said Bond as aforesaid and of the death of the said
Story it was adjudged, ordered and decreed by the said Court by a
decree pronounced in the said suit on the 8th day of November 1850,
that the said Jazwell Taylor Commissioner as aforesaid should convey to
the heirs of said Jashens Story deceased the lands purchased by the said Story at
