This indenture made the 17<sup>th</sup> day of Dec 1848 between Jas. Woodall and Margaret  
Woodall his wife of the county of Bedford and State of North Carolina of the one  
part, & Joseph B. Davis of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the other  
part. Witnesseth that the said John Woodall & Margaret his wife for and  
in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to them in hand paid by  
the said Joseph B. Davis, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, have  
granted, bargained & sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien,  
and convey unto the said Joseph B. Davis his heirs and assigns a certain  
tract or parcel of land containing two hundred & fifty acres of land to the  
same more or less as by reference to the deed of James S. Maquabburg  
Sheriff of said county of Southampton will appear, situate, lying and being in  
the County of Southampton State of Virginia and bounded as follows: From  
Beginning at a sweet gum in Major Vick's line, thence along his line to Rich  
Summer's line, thence to Scarborough's. Thence along 22 line, thence along  
his line to Edward Ricks, thence along said line to the Mill Swamp  
thence up the Mill Swamp to the bridge, thence to the beginning  
being that tract of land known and called the Collier plantation and sold  
as the property of Major John Vick under a decree of Superior court  
of Law and equity for the County of Southampton Virginia, and bought by  
said John Woodall as will appear on the records of said County. To  
have and hold the said tract of land together with all & singular  
appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Joseph B. Davis his heirs and assigns  
forever. And the said John and Margaret his wife do for themselves, their  
heirs, executors & trustees to promise and agree to warrant and forever defend  
the right of, in, to the said land to him the said Joseph B. Davis  
his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claim of any & every
