This Indenture made and entered into this 25th day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty one, between John Moore of the one part and John M. Enslay of the second part. Witnesseth that whereas James Drake conveyed by deed of trust bearing date the 24th day of July 1841 and recorded in the office of the County Court of Southampton to Thomas C. Pettow who was first Trustee John Moore being appointed in his stead by and order of the court of the County aforesaid made the 15th day of September 1841, a tract of Land containing by estimation two hundred and thirty eight acres more or less to secure the payment of a certain bond to Thomas Pettow all of which will be found fully expressed by reference to record, the said James Drake having failed to make the payment as stipulated and thereby violating the conditions annexed to said deed in trust. The said tract of Land was set up and sold on the 25th day of January eighteen hundred and fifty one to the highest bidder for cash, having previously given due notice of the same by advertising, now for and in consideration of the premises and the sum of two hundred and forty five Dollars cash in hand received the sum for which the said tract of Land was bid off. Be the said John Moore hath granted, bargained, conveyed and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto John M. Enslay the above recited tract or parcel of Land, being the same tract of Land and particularly described in the deed of trust, together with the reversion or reversions, remainder or remainders yearly and other rents, issues, and profits thereof, and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold to said last tract of Land with the tenements, hereditaments & all and singular the premises herebefore named and intended to be bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said John M. Enslay his heirs and assigns forever. And the said John Moore for himself and heirs the said tract of Land or such right thereto as he derives under the deed of trust unto the said John M. Enslay his heirs and assigns free from the claims of him the said John Moore or his heirs, shall, will and do forever defend by these presents.
