

This deed made the 22nd day of February in the year 1851, between James Fagan of the one part and Littleton R. Edwards of the other part. Witnesseth that the said James Fagan doth grant unto the said Littleton R. Edwards the following property to wit: two lots of land with the buildings and improvements thereon situate in the Town of Cumberland in the County of Southampton, one of said lots containing one acre and designated in the plan of said Town as No. 5, the other containing three fourths of an acre and being part of lot designated as Lot No. 6 in said Town and being the lots conveyed to said Fagan by William D. Clarke & also bearing equal date with those parcels. Also all his the said Fagan's household and kitchen furniture and all his other property of every description. In trust to secure a debt due William D. Clarke of six hundred dollars with interest from the 1st day of January 1851, to be paid in three annual payments, that is to say, one third of said debt and interest to be paid on the 25th day of December 1851, one half of the balance of said debt and interest to be paid on the 25th day of December 1852 and the balance or residue of said debt to be paid on the 25th day of December 1853. This indenture made and intnd into the eighteenth day of February in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & fifty one, between Samuel D. Winborne and Mary his wife of the County of Bedford and State of North Carolina of the one part and Joseph E. Gillette of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred dollars to the said Samuel D. Winborne and Mary his wife in hand paid by the said Joseph E. Gillette, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said Samuel D. Winborne and Mary his wife have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Joseph E. Gillette his heirs and assigns all the messuage and tract of land, situated, lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, containing two hundred and thirty six acres be the same more or less, and also all trees woods, under-woods, ways watercourses, houses, profits, advantages, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said messuage & above mentioned belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders rents issues and profits of said premises and every part and parcel thereof and all the estate right, title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever of them the said Samuel D. Winborne and Mary his wife of, in and to the said messuage and premises contained as follows, by the heirs of Joseph E. Gillette, Robert S. Dettlow, Elizabeth Dettlow, Emma Beale and others, it being that part or parcel of land adjoining the above named persons, allotted to Mrs. Mary S. Dettlow, now Mrs. Winston, in the allotment of the lands of James Scott dec^d. The boundaries of which will appear by reference to the report of Committee. To have and to hold the said messuage and premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Joseph E. Gillette his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use and behoof of the said Joseph E. Gillette his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Samuel D. Winborne and Mary his wife for themselves and their heirs the said messuage and premises and every part thereof against them and their heirs and every person or persons whatsoever to the said purchaser his heirs and assigns, shall and will warrant and forever defend.
