land of H. R. W. Newson, Elisha Joyner and John Putton together with all its appurte-
nances & the rents, issues & profits thereof out of every part & parcel thereof. To have
& to hold the tract of land with the tenements & all the premises hereinafore mentioned
or intended to be bargained and sold and every part & parcel thereof with every
of their rights & appurtenances unto the said John Putton his heirs & assigns forever.
And the said Wm. Beal for himself and his heirs, the said tract of land with all
its appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John Putton his heirs and assigns
further from the claim or claims of him the said William Beal or his heirs and all
and every person whatsoever. Shall, will and do warrant and forever defend by these
