This Indenture made this 10th day of March 1851 between E. S. Moore of the one part and E. J. Mashon of the other part: Witnesseth that the said E. S. Moore for the consideration of Forty five Dollars to him in hand paid by the said E. J. Mashon, have bargained and sold unto the said Mashon, a certain piece or parcel of Land containing by survey six and three eighths acres and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at an Elm tree in the middle of the black branch in the South East edge of the Road leading from Jerusalem to Black water a corner herebefore for said E. J. Mashon in said St. S. Moore's line thence along a new line made between them N. 47 E. about 11 poles to a Mulling tree new corner on the N.W. side of said Road thence N. 49 do. 12 1/2 poles to a cedar tree a new corner for the parties in the line of the Land belonging to the estate of N. M. Sebull dec'd, thence his line S. 56 do. 12 4/5 poles to the middle of said branch thence down the middle of said branch to the beginning. and the said E. S. Moore covenants with the said E. J. Mashon that he is possessed of a fee simple Estate in the piece of Land above described, and that he will forever warrant and defend the right and title to the said piece of land against the claims of himself, his heirs and all persons whomsoever.
