Barkham has lived on for the last fifteen years, and known as the said Guthbert C. Barkham's place of residence thereby leaving the said Dudley's tract flows all in a body, not adjoining the lands of the said Guthbert C. Barkham on the west, north and east and the heirs of James Pope and on the south and southwest and south-southwest, and the said Guthbert C. Barkham and Martha C.
