of the said County, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant
bargain, sell and convey unto the said Norfleet L. Pond his heirs and assigns all our interest
in a certain tract of land, which Thos H. Myrick did seized and professed situated in
said County, bounded and described as follows (viz.) By the land of John F. Davis, Savit
Harris and others, containing by estimation Sixty three and one half acres to the
same more or less together with all the privileges and appurtenances to the said
land in any wise appertaining now belonging. To have and to hold the above
granted premises to the said Norfleet L. Pond his heirs and assigns forever.
And we the said Bettie E. and Duvit C. Myrick, founders of heirs, ex-
ecutors and administrators, do covenant with the said Norfleet L. Pond, his
heirs and assigns that we are lawfully seized in fee of the before granted
premises, that they are free from all incumbrances, that we have a good
and perfect right to sell and convey the same to the said Norfleet L. Pond
his heirs and assigns as aforesaid, and that we will and our heirs ex-
ecutors and administrators shall warrant and defend the said interest in said
land to the said Norfleet L. Pond his heirs and assigns forever against
the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
