White. This Deed made the 28th day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, between Mary A. White of the one part & Seth H. Bishop of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Mary A. White doth grant unto the said Seth H. Bishop the following property, To wit: The tract of land on which the said White now resides containing about one hundred & sixty acres, or all of her interest therein, three old negroes, Sam, Johnson & Grace, two horses & then increase two cows & one calf & their increase, one yoke of oxen, Stock of hogs about thirty in number & their increase, fifteen sheep & increase, thirty geese & increase, two carts & pair of wheels, 4 ploughs six plow hoes, 8 working hoes, 2 grubbing hoes, 1 scythe, 2 iron pipes, 30 cedar casks, 40 barrels of corn, 1200 pounds bacon, parcel of peas, 25 pounds cotton, 5 beads, furniture, clothing & bedsteads, 1 side board, 4 tables, 3 trunks, 1 desk, 2 chests, 14 chairs, 2 looking glasses, 18 plates, 12 cups, & saucers, 6 dishes, 12 spoons, 4 knives, 2 lead pens, 1 corn & gun, 5 pots, 1 kettle, 1 frying pan, 2 spires, 1 stool, 4 trays, 6 saucers, 2 tubs, 2 spinning wheels, 3 pair clogs, 1 clock, about 500 pounds blade fodder, 3 axes. The said White further grants to the said Seth H. Bishop, all other crops of all kinds now planted or growing, To wit: entire crop of corn, cotton potatoes, peas &c. In trust, all of the foregoing property is granted to secure the payment of the following debts due from the said White to the parties named, To wit, a bond due to Charles Son for \$57.87, dated and on demand the 24th of April 1857 A. D. and a debt due to Mrs J. Lebell, for about \$70.00 upon which an action has been brought in one of the courts of Southampton County & is now pending, the said two debts to be paid to Leblake & Pope & Wm. J. Lebell to be paid first and then the following debts to be paid per rata To wit on bond due Elizabeth McClemmy for \$29.43, dated May 29th 1843 also another bond due the same for \$17.29 dated June 19th A. D. 1850, an open account for \$38.25 due to Alfred Hicks an open account due to Alexander
