This Deed made the 17th day of July year 1857, between William C. Barrett
 of the first part, J. R. Rockelle of the second part and Margaret P. Barrett
 of the third part all of said parties of the County of Southampton and State
 of Virginia: Whereas the said William C. Barrett is in debt to the said
 Margaret P. Barrett by bond bearing date the 1st day of January years
 1857, in the sum of Two hundred and sixty dollars, and the said William C.
 Barrett being willing to secure the aforesaid debt, now this indenture
 witnesses that for and in consideration of the promise and further
 consideration of ten dollars to him in hand paid, he the said William
 C. Barrett, do grant, bargain and sell to the said J. R. Rockelle the
 following named property, to wit: Three feather beds, bedsteads and necessary
 bedding for the same, six sitting chairs, made of wood, six other chairs made of
 walnut timber, one chest painted blue, three tables, one of which made of Walnut
 Timbers one desk of Walnut Timbers a parson saw all my Tin and earthen ware
 twenty pieces of glass ware, one common wood clock, three iron pots four pair
 hoes, one spade, two fry pans, two corns, two pottrucks, one bible and five
 other books, one looking glass, one pair smooth Irons, pair andirons, pair
 brass candlesticks, four tubs, three pales, case of knives & forks one bay mare
 one vehicle or buggy, two cows, two calves and their future increase, one pig,
 twenty head of hogs, and their increase, five black hoes, three canters
 three axes, three grub hoes, five wheel hoes, fourteen cedar casks, one
 pair cast wheels, & two carts, present growing crop of corn, fodder, cotton,
 potatoes, peas, shucks, & gleanings of my fields forever. Upon trust
 nevertheless, that the said J. R. Rockelle shall at the request of her
 the said Margaret P. Barrett, or her legal representative after giving
 at least ten days notice of the intended sale, sell at public
 auction for cash the aforesaid property or so much thereof as may
 be sufficient to pay and discharge the said debt, interest and costs, if
 so much then be and out of the proceeds first pay the expenses thereof, then
 pay the aforesaid debt and interest, and the surplus if any pay over to the said William C. Bar-
