This Deed made the 16th day of July year 1857, between William S. Barrett
grantor and Jacob Barnes purchaser each of whom reside in the County of
Southampton, This deed witnesseth that he the said Barrett, have for and in
consideration of the sum of Twenty dollars to him in hand paid by the
said Jacob Barnes, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have granted
bargained and sold to him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns
forever after simple estate in and to a certain portion of land lying and
being in the above named County, same bounded as follows: To wit: Beginning
in the above named parties line at a post oak so called from said oak nearly
an east course, said parties line to the land devised by said Barnes to certain
trustees for the Methodist Episcopal Church same direction to said parties
line again same direction to the fence so called, then along said
road nearly a south course to the second drain from said oak near
a southwest course to a certain ditch on the edge of which said
Barrett's fence is now erect, and has been for many years, then
nearly a northwest course along said ditch to the said post oak,
which boundaries as above named is supposed to contain about
five acres of land for him said Barnes; to have and to hold free
from the claim of him the said Barrett his heirs or assigns and
also free from the claim of any and every person or persons whomsoever
to him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns forever, the title
whereof the said Barrett warrants and forever defends by these
presents. In witness whereof he the said William S. Barrett has here
set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first above
written.

for the term of two years next ensuing. Now if the said Robert S. Fitch shall faithfully discharge the duties
of the said office or trust according to law, during his continuance therein, then the above obligation is to be
void, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
