This indenture, made and entered into this 14th day of February in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, between Zachariah Doyle and Polly his wife, of the county of Southampton, and parish of Stotoway of the one part and William Drake of the same County and parish of the other part: - Witnesseth that the said Zachariah Doyle and Polly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of twenty eight dollars and fifty cents to them in hand paid by the said William Drake, the receipt is hereby acknowledged hath granted and sold and confirmed unto the said William Drake his heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of of land, containing by estimation five and a half acres be the same more or less, and bounded as follows: To wit: beginning at black gum standing in a branch in Benjamin Wouells and Zachariah Doyle's line, thence down said branch to the fork of the branch in said Wouells line and Leary Humbley's line, thence up said branch to a poplar in said Humbley's line and Zachariah Doyle's line, thence a line of marked trees to the first station together with all the appurtenances whatsoever belonging or in any way appertaining to the said tract of land and premises to have and to hold to the same unto the said William Drake to him and his heirs forever. And the said Zachariah Doyle and Polly his wife doth by these presents grant to and with the said William Drake, that they will warrant and defend all right, title, claim or demand to the same or any part thereof.
