Leibel, to the said James Drumgore, he shall after having given ten days notice of the time and place by public advertisement at the Courthouse door of Southampton County proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder for cash the property abovesaid and out of the money coming from the sale after defraying the expenses of this trust, pay the debts herein mentioned, and the balance if any pay over to the said John L. Bishop.

This Decree, made and entered into this 10<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D. 1851, between Septha Garden of the first part, Goodwin & Cutler of the second part and Elizabeth Whithead of the third part, whereas a marriage is shortly intended to be had and solemnized between the above named Septha Garden and Elizabeth Whithead and whereas the said Elizabeth Whithead is possessed of and entitled to compeisonal property, to-wit: three feather beds and furniture, 1 shirt of floss, 1 Loom & Hatters, household and kitchen furniture, and whereas it has been agreed by and between the said Septha Garden and Elizabeth Whithead the said property and any other property now held by the said Elizabeth Whithead or to which she may be entitled or hereafter acquire or be entitled to, shall be vested in a trustee to hold by him in trust in the manner and for the purposes hereafter mentioned & declared and for none other. Now therefore in consideration of the premises & of the sum of one dollar by the said Goodwin & Cutler to the said Elizabeth Whithead in hand paid the said Elizabeth Whithead with the privacy, consent & agreement of the said Septha Garden with grant, bargain, sell, let over and transfer to the said William M. Cutler, all the property, money, debt and balance of which the said Elizabeth Whithead is possessed or to which she is or may hereafter be entitled in Law or equity. To have and to hold the same for the trusts and purposes following, that is to say, in trust for the said Elizabeth and her assigns until the solemnization of the said marriage, then upon trust that the said Goodwin & Cutler, his heirs, assigns or assigns shall and will permit the said Septha Garden during the joint lives of himself and the said Elizabeth his intended wife to receive and take all the issue, profits, & interest of the said property, debts & legacies & monies to and for the joint use and benefit of the said Septha & Elizabeth and forth the benefit and support of the issue of the said intended marriage, and at the death of the said Elizabeth the said property and increase thereof to pass in such manner to such persons as she the said Elizabeth by her last will & testament

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
