Bittle his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns forever, in manner and form following, that is to say; that the said Micajah Hollerman his heirs, Executors, and administrators the aforesaid property unto the said Henry T. Bittle his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant any favour, defend by these presents. Upon trust nevertheless, that the said Henry T. Bittle his heirs, Executors, and administrators shall permit the said Micajah Hollerman to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said property and take the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in the payments and then upon this further trust, that he or the survivor of him, or the heirs, Executors, administrators or assigns of each survivor shall and will do soon after the happening of each default of payment as he or the survivor of him, or the heirs, Executors, administrators or assigns, may think proper or the said Jacob Williams and Mills L. Gray, or either of them, their Executors administrators or assigns shall request, sell the property as the trustee shall think sufficient for the purpose, or shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for cash at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale, and giving ten days notice thereof by advertisement to be set up at the door of the courthouse of Southampton County and other necessary places previous to the day of sale and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof, and all other expenses attending the aforesaid property, pay to the said Jacob Williams and Mills L. Gray, their Executors, administrators or assigns the said sum of forty dollars, and the balance if any shall pay to the said Micajah Hollerman his heirs, Executors, administrators or assigns, but if the whole of the said sum of forty dollars shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Jacob Williams and Mills L. Gray their Executors, administrators or assigns on or before the 25th day of December one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, so that no default of payment of the said sum of forty dollars, then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
