Rollings there is a default in payment of the above named sum with interest &c. arising therefrom, but if the said William Beal shall complain to the said Patrick H. Rollings and make it fully appear that there has been such a default of the payment of the above named sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with interest thereon &c. he then if the said William Beal shall order advertise all the above named crop of corn, fodder, cotton, peas &c. for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for ready money on the premises by giving ten days previous notice of the day of sale and sale of the money arising from such sale, first pay to the said Wm. Beal the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with interest that may be due thereon with the cost of this Indenture. The balance if any pay to the said Henry Booth his heirs &c. But the condition of this Indenture is such that if the said Henry Booth shall make satisfactory with the said William Beal, it shall be void and of non effect, otherwise to remain with full force and virtue.
