This Indenture, made and entered into this 4th day of October 1851, between James R. Brock, of the first part, Sam'l Kello, of the second part, and Jno. M. Guiley of the third part: Whereas the said James R. Brock is justly indebted to the said Jno. M. Guiley by bond bearing date the 8th day of Sept: 1851, payable with interest from date for the sum of fifty three dollars & 69 cents, which debt the said James R. Brock is desirous to secure: Now the indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said James R. Brock in hand paid by the said Sam'l Kello at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said J. R. Brock hath given grants, bargains and sales unto the said Sam'l Kello his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit: 13 head of hogs, all the interest of the said Brock in the growing crop cultivation on the lands of Joseph Holland to have and to hold the said hereby granted property to him the said Sam'l Kello his heirs and assigns forever. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Sam'l Kello his heirs or assigns shall permit the said James R. Brock to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the property hereby conveyed until default be made in the payment of the said bond either in the whole or in part. And then upon this further trust that he the said Sam'l Kello shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment as he may think proper or the said Jno. M. Guiley may require shall sell the property hereby conveyed, or so much as may be sufficient to pay and satisfy the bond & interest which may accrue, as well as all cost attending these premises, after giving due notice of the time and place of such sale, if any surplus remains pay the same to the said James R. Brock or such person as he may authorize to receive the same. In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals the day and date first above written.

Sealed with our seals and dated this 20th day of October 1851.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the aforesaid Davis Joyner who is appointed Constable in the Lower District of Nottoway Parish in the County of Southampton shall faithfully discharge the duties of said office or
