This Indenture, made and entered into, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty one, between Joseph E. Lillie of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and the said S<sup>t</sup> H. Bishop of the same County and State of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Joseph E. Lillie for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand nine hundred and eleven dollars and seventy five cents lawfully due and to be paid to him on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 1852 by the said S<sup>t</sup> H. Bishop, at the sealing and delivery of these presents bargained and sold unto him the said S<sup>t</sup> H. Bishop his heirs and assigns forever, three certain Tracts or parcels of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke's, containing six hundred and thirty seven & one fourth acres be the same more or less, to wit: one tract containing one hundred and ninety three and half acres being 166 acres which Joseph E. Lillie purchased of Richard L. Garton, and 2 1/2 acres his wife, Cordia Emeline, inherited from her father, Lewis Howell, and known by the names of Archer & Story, Miles Story, Richard Garton, C. B. Barrett and others. One tract containing two hundred and five acres known as the Blow and Edwards tract, inherited by said Joseph E. Lillie's wife from her father, and bounded by the lands of Richard Garton, Archer Vick, Henry Blow, Thomas Pickley, C. B. Barrett and others, and one tract containing two hundred and thirty eight and three fourth acres known as the Blow tract inherited by said Joseph E. Lillie's wife from her father, and bounded by the lands of Henry Blow, Miles Story, and by the land formerly owned by Williams Vick and others: To have and to hold the above described three tracts or parcels of land and premises with all and singular their appurtenances thereto belonging or any wise appertaining unto him the said S<sup>t</sup> H. Bishop his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said S<sup>t</sup> H. Bishop his heirs and assigns forever; and the said Joseph E. Lillie for himself his heirs, Executors and administrators, doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said S<sup>t</sup> H. Bishop his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid three tracts or parcels of land and premises against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said Joseph E. Lillie hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal, the day and year first above written.
