ThisIndenture, made this 20th day of October 1857, between James W. Parker & Martha Ann his wife of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part, & Henry B. Vaughan of the aforesaid County & State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Parker & wife for & in consideration of the sum of five dollars lawful money of the United States to them by the said Vaughan in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold & by these presents do grant, bargain, sell & convey, unto the said Vaughan his heirs & assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land containing three to half acres more or less lying & being in the County & State aforesaid & bounded as follows: Beginning at a pine tree on the side of the road from Jerusalem to Nick's ford at the hill above the path leading from the Indian Woods to Riddle's Mill, thence by line of marked trees northwesterly to a Hickory in the old Christian line, thence along said line till it intersect the said road, thence down said road to the beginning. To have & to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Vaughan his heirs & assigns, to the only proper use & behoof of the said Vaughan his heirs & assigns forever. And the said Parker & his wife for themselves, their heirs, executors & administrators do hereby covenant & agree to & with the said Vaughan his heirs & assigns, that they the said Parker & wife & their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances unto him the said Vaughan, his heirs & assigns, against them the said Parker & wife & heirs against all persons all persons whomsoever, shall & will by these presents forever warrant & defend.
