This Deed, made this 25th day of October 1857, between Henry P. Vaughan of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part & James W. Parker of the aforesaid County & State of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Vaughan for & in consideration of the sum of five dollars lawful money of the United States to him by the said Parker in handpaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained sold by these presents with grant, bargain sell & convey unto the said Parker his heirs & assigns a certain tract or parcel of land, containing three & a half acres more or less, lying & being in the County & State aforesaid & bounded as follows: Beginning at the point where the old Indian line crosses the present road leading from Jerusalem to Greenville, thence Southwestwardly to the Little Swamp, where it intersects or crosses the Cropsey road near Lewis Norrell's gate, thence along the said road to the beginning of all the land on the South side of the road from Jerusalem to the Cropsey Ridge, which the said Vaughan purchased of the Indian tract & of Thomas Fitzhugh. To have & to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging, to him the said Parker his heirs & assigns to the only proper use & behoof of the said Parker his heirs & assigns forever. And the said Vaughan for himself, his heirs, executors & administrators, doth hereby covenant & agree to & with the said Parker his heirs & assigns, that the said Vaughan & his heirs the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances unto him the said Parker his heirs & assigns against him the said Vaughan, his heirs, & against all persons whomsoever, shall & will, by these presents, forever warrant & defend. In witness whereof, the said Vaughan has hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal, the day & year above written.
