Edwards the following property, to wit: A certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and containing by estimation two hundred and seventy five and a half acres more or less being the same tract of land conveyed by Edwards Butte to the said George Griffin by deed executed the 22^d day of November 1857. In witness whereof the payment of a debt due Edwards Butte by him executed this day for three hundred and fifty dollars with interest from the 25th day of December next and on demand the 25th day of December 1858. This Deed made this first day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, between Nancy Pope, Madison Pope, Oswald Pope, Eliza Pope, Isaac S. Pope, Emma Frances Pope, Pearson Pope and Richard Pope the two latter Pearson and Richard by their attorney Oswald Pope of the first part and Amos S. Pope and Philip S. Claus of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Nancy, Madison, Oswald, Eliza, Isaac, Emma, Pearson & Richard Pope in consideration of one thousand three hundred and eighty one 7/10 dollars to them in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do grant unto the said Amos S. Pope and Philip S. Claus all their interest in that tract of land lying in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, containing about four hundred and sixty one acres more or less (the grave goes excepted) it being the plantation on which Nathan Pope deceased lived in his life time and bounded as follows: by the Lands of Richard Parden, Jacob Williams, John St. Myrick, Harrison S. Pope and others and by the County road, and the said grantors covenant that they will warrant generally and especially their respective interest in the land hereby conveyed and that the said grantees shall have quiet and peaceable possession of the said land as far as the grantors or any claims under them all concerns. It must be understood that the said Nancy Pope intends to convey and grant her dower or life estate only in and to the said land. In witness whereof, the said parties to these presents have
