Holland for himself and his wife doth grant unto the said Marcus Dols two certain tracts or parcels of land joining each other, the one known as the place on which Mrs. Frances Lenaw died; the other which I purchased of Wilson Wellons both situated in the county of Southampton, containing by estimation five hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded by the land of Dr. H. Burgess, Wilson Wellons, Mary B. Lord, and Thurgass Lenaw and the said Joseph S. Holland for himself and his wife Louisa consent that he will warrant generally the property herein conveyed.
