This deed, made and entered into on this 24th day of October year 1851, by and between
 Martha Bynum of the county of Southampton in the State of Virginia and Adolphus
 Bynum her son of the county of Marion in the State of Missouri of the one part,
 and Jacob Barnes of the county of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the
 other part: This deed witnesseth that they the said Martha Bynum and
 her said son Adolphus Bynum have for and in consideration of the sum of forty
 dollars to them in hand paid at the sealing and delivery of this deed the
 receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold unto
 this said Jacob Barnes, bargain and sell unto the said Jacob Barnes all
 their right, title and interest and estate which they the said Martha Bynum
 and Adolphus Bynum her son have in and to a certain portion or parcel
 of land lying and being in the said county of Southampton, supposed to
 contain thirty three & three acres be the same more or less it being
 virtually the lands devised by the last Will and Testament of Volad
 Rovel dec'd to her the said Martha Bynum during her natural life
 and at her death to her several children and their heirs, and the
 said Adolphus Bynum being one of them; To have and to hold the said
 interest in the lands thus devised as aforesaid to him the said Jacob Barnes
 his heirs and assigns forever, free from the claim of them the said
 Martha Bynum and Adolphus Bynum her son, their and each of their
 heirs and assigns, and also free from the claim of all and every person
 and persons whomsoever, do by this deed warrant and forever defend
 in fee simple, the right and title devised as aforesaid, to him the said
