This Indenture made this third day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two, between Sherod Smith of the county of Dinwiddie and State of Virginia, of the one part and William Spivey of the county of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the other part: Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of thirty nine dollars and thirty seven and a half cents to the said Sherod Smith in hand paid by the said William Spivey, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, confirmed and do by these presents give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey, confirm unto the said William Spivey a certain lot, tract or parcel of land situated and lying in said county of Southampton and being a part of the land said Sherod Smith purchaser of C. Butts & A. A. Johnson, containing by more survey thirty five acres be the same more or less, bounded as follows: beginning on George Spivey's line at a light post, head of Hannah's branch thence running North 5° E. 36 poles, thence E. 2 poles thence N. 2° E. 80 poles to red-oak, thence S. 76° W. 40 to pine, thence S. 13 1/2° W. 65 poles, thence S. 2° W. 48 poles to Hannah's branch thence up branch to the beginning: To have and to hold all the within described premises or appertinances therunto belonging or thereto appertaining to the said William Spivey that he will warrant and defend all right, title, claim or demands, claiming by or through him of every other person or persons whatsoever to the only use and behoof of him the said William Spivey and his heirs forever.
