Pope of the other part; Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of Four thousand eight hundred and thirty five dollars the said Newson hath granted unto the said Pope a certain house and lot situated in the town of Jerusalem designated as Lot No 20, and at present occupied by the said Newson as a Tavern, together with the garden house lot and other lands attached thereto belonging to the said Newson also all the household furniture save of except such furniture as is in the private part of the house and in the offices next the rear of the Tavern house: also the said Newson doth grant unto Pope a tract of land lying in Flagg Run and which the said Newson bought of Thomas L.
