This Indenture, made this 16th day of February 1852, between John D. Wick
of the one part and Daniel Wick of the other part, both of the County of South-
ampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth that said John Wick conveyed
by deed of Trust bearing date the 5th of July 1843, and recorded in
the Office of the County of Southampton to the aforesaid Dees D. Wick
one tract of land called Colliers, containing three hundred and twenty
some more or less, and now bounded by the land as follows
By the land of Edwards Butte, James Bellet, Joseph Davis, James
Jenkins, & Mrs. Allman lying and being in the County of Southampton
to secure the payment of a certain bond due from said John Wick
