Stephenson and wife Nancy of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Meritt J. Davis of the said County and State of the other part; Witnesseth that the said William R. Stephenson and Nancy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to them in hand paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained, granted, sold and confirmed and by these presents do bargain, grant, sell and confirm to the said Meritt J. Davis and his assigns forever with its appurtenances a certain parcel or tract of land lying and being near Berlin in the County of Southampton containing two acres and bounded as follows: commencing at a small red oak situated on the road leading to Danche's meeting house the line running due east of North ninety eight yards to a certain post or stake, then from the said post or stake one hundred yards west to another certain post, then from the said post ninety eight yards south to the line of the land belonging to the heirs of John G. Faison & due & thence along the said Faison's line the first named tract to a small red oak. To have and to hold the said land and its appurtenances to his only proper use and behoof of him the said Meritt J. Davis and his assigns, free from the claims of him the said William R. Stephenson and his wife Nancy and all and every person or persons whatsoever, claiming the land - the right and title whereof
