Witnesseth that the said Newton and Bridgick Pope (by their attorney as aforesaid) doth hereby grant, sell and convey to the said Phillip and Amos all of their right, title and interest of every kind whatsoever within in perpetuity, remainder or reversion, in and to a certain tract of land lying in the County of Southampton, it being the same on which the late Nathan Pope resided during his lifetime and bounded as follows to-wit: by the lands of Richard Darrow, of Jacob Williams, of John S.
