Barrett to be used by him and his family until such time as she may think proper to allow it, and shall call for the same; the following proper to wit: Three beds and furniture, six Windsor chairs, six flag bottom chairs, two walnut Tables, one pine Table, one dressing Table, one desk, one lot of iron ware, one lot of earthen-ware, lot of Glass ware, one wood clock, three iron Pots & four pair hooks, one Spider, two flying pans, two rods, two foot racks, lot wood ware, one pair set in two, set knives & forks, one bag man, one buggy, two cows and calves, and their increase, one ox, three Sows and thirteen Shoats and their increase, one set plow and gear, three axes, lot wood hoes, lot iron crabs, one cart and pair cart wheels the crops of all kinds now growing on the plantation upon which the said William S. Harrison of the second part and Edward Beaton Harrison of the third part; Witnesseth that whereas the said Lewis Wells stands justly indebted unto the said Edward Beaton in the sum of Seventy Six dollars and Twenty five due by bond or note on the 10th day of July 1852 and being desirous to secure the payment thereof both for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said John W. Harrison, bargained and sold, aliened, conveyed, confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain & sell, alien, convey and confirm unto the said John W. Harrison his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns the following property to wit: a certain tract or or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred and ninety acres more or less, bounded as follows: to wit: North by Richard Porter, East by Mrs. Nancy Powell, South by Edwin Harris, West by Harriet Whitehead, also four feather beds and furniture, one chest of drawers, one folding table one large bedstead, four pine chest, twelve head of hogs and other various twenty four setting chairs four small tables, one large looking glass all my farming tools, all my household and kitchen furniture one loom and gear, and my present crop of corn now growing, and one cart and wheels, also two shot guns.
