This deed made and entered into this 14th day of August in the year 1852, by and between Elizabeth S. A. Williams, Cornelia Williams, Virginia Pitt, and Spratley Williams, all of the County of Southampton of the one part and William S. Goodwyn, Justice of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Elizabeth S. A. Williams, Cornelia Williams, Virginia Pitt and Spratley Williams do by these presents give, grant, and convey unto the said William S. Goodwyn trustee all their right, title and interest in and to the tract of land lying in the County aforesaid containing about 42 1/4 acres, being the same tract of land whereon the parties of the first part are now residing and bounded by the lands of Thomas N. Maguheart, Robert Dingley dec'd, William M. Everett and Nancy Miller. In trust to secure a debt due by bond executed by the parties of the first part to Samuel Drayton in the sum of seven hundred and fifty seven dollars of 24/100 with interest thereon from the date thereof, and bearing the same date with this deed. And the said parties of the first part covenant with the said Goodwyn to warrant and defend the title to the aforesaid tract of land against the claims of all persons.
