This Indenture, under this eighteenth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty two, between Henry Booth of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the first part, William Beal of the County of Hertford and State of North Carolina of the second part, and Richard B. Travis of the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Trustee, of the third part, Witnesseth whereas the said Henry Booth is justly indebted to the said William Beal in the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars and is willing and desirous to secure the same, and for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Richard B. Travis, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath given, granted, bargained and sold and do by these presents give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said Richard B. Travis, of all his present standing crop of corn, fodder, peas, beans, &c. to the only use and behoof of him the said Richard B. Travis, as Trustee, and the said Richard B. Travis shall let the said Henry Booth remain in quiet possession of all until the said William Beal shall complain and make it appear that there is a default in the payment of the said debt of one hundred and fifty dollars at which time if he shall so order the said Richard B. Travis shall advertise by giving Ten days previous notice and sell on the premises all the abovesaid crop for ready money or as short credit as they may deem proper and out of the effects arising from such sale first pay the said William Beal the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with the cost of this Indenture next pay to Nicholas J. Barham the sum of thirty dollars for rent of plantation, the balance if any pay to the said Henry Booth. His above obligation is such if there shall not arise any complaint of default in the payment of the abovesaid sum of one hundred and fifty dollars on payment be well and truly made, then this Indenture be null and void and of non effect otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
