This Deed made this 1st day of October in the year 1853, between George M. S. Williamson of the first part, and Thomas Wrenn Trustee of the second part, and Lucy S. Williamson of the third part, Whereas one Elizabeth Clanton deceased by her will dated the 1st of January 1835, and of record in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton gave to Kinchen Jelks and Nancy Jelks her wife certain slaves and other property therein specified for the term of their natural lives and at their deaths for the said estate together with its increase to be divided equally between the heirs of Nancy Jelks, and whereas Kinchen Jelks did by his will dated the 24th of November 1849, and of record in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton bequeath to his wife Nancy Jelks his land with all kinds of timber thereon, also all his Stock of all kinds during her life and at her death direct the said property to be sold and from the money arising therefrom give to his daughter Mary Williams fifty dollars and the balance of his estate to be equally divided between his daughter Lucy S. Jelks and his two sons James R. & Amos S. Jelks and whereas George M. S. Williamson has married the said Lucy S. Jelks and is evermore and desirous from the love and affection and moral obligation there is upon him to provide a support and maintenance for her and her children by securing to her the property given her in the wills of Elizabeth Clanton and Kinchen Jelks for her own proper use and now in possession of Nancy Jelks the life tenant. Now therefore this Indenture witnesses, that in consideration of the promises and for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid the said George M. S. Williamson doth grant to the said Thomas Wrenn all the right, title and interest which he has in reversion or remainder of, in or to the estates of Elizabeth Clanton and Kinchen Jelks. Upon Trust nevertheless, that in and after the death of Nancy Jelks the life tenant, the said Thomas Wrenn is to take possession of all the property and estate coming to Lucy S. Williamson by virtue of the wills of Elizabeth Clanton and Kinchen Jelks and hold the same and apply the profits thereof to the separate maintenance and support of the said Lucy S. Williamson and her children free from the control or direction of George M. S. Williamson to enjoy the same to the said Lucy S. Williamson and her children and should she die first then to her children, but should she die in the lifetime of her husband without issue then to George M. S. Williamson.
