This indenture, made this 4th day of October 1853, between Arthur A. Drewry, Jesse C. Drewry, and Horace Drewry. Witness that Jesse C. Drewry in consideration of one dollar in hand paid to him by Horace Drewry, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, doth convey in Trust to the above named Horace Drewry, one certain tract or parcel of land to him and his heirs forever, containing by estimation one hundred and ten acres lying in the county of Nansemond and State of Virginia, formerly belonging to the estate of Joseph Gordon, and adjoining the lands of Samuel Estling and others and lying on Chancelled Creek, Also one other tract of land lying in the County of Southampton and formerly owned by Peter Goodman, and now occupied by Mrs. Corblynn Drewry containing acres and adjoining the lands of of James S. Masonburg, Joseph Gillett and others: Now the above obligation is such that whereas Arthur A. Drewry is bound as security for Jesse C. Drewry in two bonds, one executed for the benefit of Peter Goodman for Forty four Dollars, do due December 31st 1851, one other bond, executed for the benefit of John Putter for Three hundred and thirty dollars, due December 31, 1851. Now the above obligation is such that if the above bond Jesse C. Drewry shall discharge by payment the above named bonds then the above obligation to be null and void, but if Jesse C.
