and confirm unto the said Johnney Thomas Travis, a certain lot, tract or
parcel of land lying and situate in said County of Southampton and State
aforesaid containing by estimation one hundred and sixty acres by the same
more or less, bounded as follows, to wit: By the lands of John Kitchen
and Charlotte Woodson, on the south; by the lands of Willie Wellons,
and Lambert Watkins on the east; by the lands of James M. Anderson,
John Hines and Nicholas J. Baham on the North; also by the said
Benjamin Travis and the Baham road on the west: To have and to
