This Indenture, made this Tenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two between Benjamin Travis, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part, and Johnny Thomas Travis of the aforesaid County and State of the second part: Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the natural affection to which the said Benjamin Travis bears to the said Johnny Thomas Travis and for the further consideration of the sum of twenty five dollars to the said Benjamin Travis in hand paid by the said Johnny Thomas Travis, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and do by these presents give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey, and confirm unto the said Johnny Thomas Travis, a certain lot, tract or parcel of land lying and situate in said County of Southampton and State of Virginia containing by estimation one hundred and eighty acres be the same more or less, bounded as follows, to-wit: By the lands of John Stetson and Charlotte Woodson, on the south; by the lands of Willis Wellons, and Lambert Watkins on the east; by the lands of James M. Anderson, John Davis and Nicholas J. Carham on the North; and by the said Benjamin Travis and the Colburn road on the west: To have and to hold all the within described premises or appertinances thereto belonging or otherwise appertaining to the same, to the only use and behoof of him the said Johnny Thomas Travis and his heirs forever. And the said Benjamin Travis do further covenant and agree to and with the said Johnny Thomas Travis that he will for ever warrant and defend, at all right, title, claim or demand, claiming by and through him, of any other person or persons whatsoever, to the only use and behoof of him the said Johnny Thomas Travis and his heirs forever.
