

sth. being made and entered into on the 13th day of November in the year 1852, by and between Dolly Jackson and Jacob Barnes of the one part, and John Harwood of the other part, each and all said parties of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, that whereas the said John Harwood has this the 13th day of November 1852, paid to the above named Jacob Barnes the sum of twenty dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by them the said Jackson and said Barnes to the discharge of the above named debt due from said Jackson to said Barnes, now in consideration of which payment as aforesaid, they the said Dolly Jackson and Jacob Barnes have bargained and sold unto the said John Harwood a certain lot and portion of land the boundaries of which is now the lands of Josiah Vick, Selah Ellsworth, and said Harwood supposed to contain about ten acres the mother not with the parties whether more or less, said land lying in the lower district of Saint Luke's Parish, to have and to hold the said portion of land described as aforesaid free from the claim of them the said Dolly Jackson and the said Jacob Barnes their or either of their heirs or assigns. And also said Dolly Jackson further says free from the claim or demand of all and every person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof she the said Jackson and Jacob Barnes have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals, this 13th day of November year 1852.
