Whereas the said Jesse Cobb do by deed executed the 9<sup>th</sup> day of February 1851, and recorded in the Clerk's Office the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February 1851, did convey to the said Joseph Darden a tract of property containing one hundred and five acres more or less and the following personal property to wit: One horse saddle, ten shoats, one cart & wheels & gear, one lot of ploughs, two axes, Applemill fixtures, nine casks, twelve hundred pounds of fodder, twelve barrels of gun one gun, half a dozen chairs, one set of crutching, one bro, three brooms, one chest, three sets of iron, to be held by the said Joseph Darden in trust for the sole & separate use & benefit of the said Lydia M. Fowler during her natural life free from all the claims of her husband Henry Fowler. And whereas since the execution of the deed aforesaid the said Henry Fowler has departed this life and the parties hereto agree that the personal property aforesaid or so much of it as now remains shall be conveyed to and vested in the said Lydia M. Fowler in fee simple. Now therefore the said Joseph Darden with the consent of the said Jesse Cobb hereby conveys & transfers unto the said Lydia M. Fowler the personal property above named to have and to hold to her for her own proper use forever. This deed made this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December in the year 1853, between William L. Goodwyn of the one part, M. B. Cole, John Whitehead, Jesse Nargrave sons, of John M. Williamson and Edward S. Revere and M. S. Peters, Executors of Sampson C. Reese of the other part. Whereas the said William L. Goodwyn on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year 1840, in order to indemnify and secure the said M. B. Cole, John Whitehead, John M. Williamson and Sampson C. Reese against loss and injury as his securities to a bond executed to the County Court of Southampton for the guardianship of the children and heirs of George Carham dec<sup>d</sup> did by indenture of that date, admitted to record, convey to the said M. L. Goodwyn his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Southampton, more particularly described and bounded in said deed, and upon certain trusts therein mentioned as will more fully appear by reference to said deed of record in the Clerk's Office of said County, and whereas since the execution of the said deed of trust the said William L. Goodwyn has fully secured and indemnified the said parties of the third part against all loss and responsibility for which it was thereby intended to indemnify them, which security and indemnity the said parties acknowledge.
