This deed made the twenty-fourth day of the first month (January) 1853, between James Harris of the one part and Joseph Harris of the other part both parties residing in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: with the faith that in consideration of the natural love and affection which the said James Harris hath and doth bear to and for his son the said Joseph Harris, the said James Harris doth grant unto the said Joseph Harris (reserving a life estate therein for and during the life time of him the said James Harris) three certain pieces or parcels of land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia some of which contains by survey nearly nine acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows: to-wit: beginning at a post oak a corner tree in the corner line formerly John Lawrence's thence N. 61° W. 14 1/2 poles to a lightwood post in John Lawrence's line formerly John Lawrence's thence N. 32° East 38 poles to a pine standing in the head of a small branch, thence along the said branch the corner comes thence to the road leading from Long's bridge to Black water bridge; thence down the road 1850 to 2 1/2 poles

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
