This indenture, made the 25th day of February in the year of our Lord, one
thousand eight hundred and fifty three, between the Seaboard and Roanoke
Rail Road Company, a corporation duly constituted as such by the laws
of the States of Virginia and North Carolina of the first part and
Robert Stylor of the city of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania
of the other part.

Whereas at the annual meeting of the Stock holders of the said Company
on the 24th day of the present month the following resolutions were
unanimously adopted:

Resolved, that the stockholders of the company accept the provisions of
an act of the Legislature of North Carolina, entitled "an act concern-
ing the Seaboard and Roanoke Rail Road Company," passed Novem-
ber 29th 1852, and of an act of the Legislature of Virginia
entitled "an act concerning the Seaboard and Roanoke Rail
Road Company" passed the 28th day of January 1853.

And whereas the company are authorized under the provisions of
the said acts to borrow money at a rate of interest not
exceeding seven per cent per annum payable semi-annually (and
to make their loans or any portion of them, if they should
deem it advisable to do so convertible into stock of the
company
