Barkham being willing and desirous to secure the aforesaid debt and interest. Now this indenture, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar to him the said Saml N. Barkham in hand paid by the said Benj^e C. Everett at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, be the said Saml N. Barkham hath given, granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain, and sell to the said Benj^e C. Everett his heirs and assigns forever, the following, negro slaves, to-wit: woman Lavinia, and two children Susan and Ellen and their future increase. To have and to hold to his the said Samuel N. Barkham's proper use and behoof forever, upon trust nevertheless that the said Benj^e C. Everett shall at the request of either one of the aforesaid parties after giving at least ten days notice of the time and place of sale, sell at public auction for cash all the property herein named or so much thereof, as shall be sufficient to satisfy said debt and interest and out of the proceeds first pay the expenses thereof, then pay the debts aforesaid with interest and the balance if any pay over to the said Saml N. Barkham or his legal representative. And the said Saml N. Barkham covenants with the said Benj^e C. Everett that he is possessed of an absolute fee simple right to all the property herein named and that he will forever warrant and defend the same against himself and all other persons whatsoever.
