And I hereby warrant and defend the title of said property against the claim or claims of myself or my heirs and of all other persons whatsoever unto the said Seth D. Edwards & Seabell
This deed, made the 20th day of April 1853, between Littleton R. Edwards and John L. Bishop and Caroline R. his wife of the one part and William J. Seabell of the other part. Whereas the said John L. Bishop by deed of date the 22nd day of July 1850, and admitted to record the 7th day of November 1850, conveyed to the said Littleton R. Edwards a lot or piece of land lying adjacent to the Town of Jerusalem in the County of Southampton, containing two acres more or less, being the same lot or piece of land lately purchased by the said Bishop at a sale by John M. Gurley commissioner acting under a decree of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Southampton County in the suit of Bishop against Deongelis and others. In trust to indemnify Wm J. Seabell as security for the said Bishop in a certain bond required to Jas. M. Gurley for the sum of one thousand four hundred thirty two dollars & 80 cts and due 20th day of May 1851. And the said Littleton R. Edwards having been required so to do by the said Wm J. Seabell did on the 18th day of April 1853, having given reasonable public notice thereof set up and sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash in the Town of Jerusalem, the aforesaid lot or piece of land and at the sale so made the said William J. Seabell became the purchaser of the said lot or piece of land by bidding therefor the sum of one thousand two hundred and fifty dollars which was the highest made for the same.
