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This deed made this 2nd day of May 1853, between Jas. M. Guilford special Commissioner appointed to make sale of the real estate of David H. Dringdale dec'd by a decree of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for the County of Southampton, pronounced at November term 1849 of the one part, Thomas H. Drake of the second. Witnesseth that in consideration of one Hundred Dollars the said Thomas H. Drake purchased under said sale one certain tract of Land containing one hundred acres more or less, situated two miles north of Jerusalem and bounded by the lands of Dr. Thomas J. Drtlow & others, and the said Thomas H. Drake being willing to surrender his title acquired under said purchase signifies the same by being a party to these presents. The John M. Guilford as Commissioner aforesaid and the said Thomas H. Drake doth grant unto Jonathan Darden in consideration of the aforesaid sum of one hundred dollars the said tract of land. To Have and to hold the said tract of land to him the said Jonathan Darden and his heirs forever. Witness our hands and seals this day and date first above written.
