This deed made the 26th day of May 1853, between William Prince of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the first part, and William S. Goodwyn of Greenville of the second part, and Saml. Drury, David Prince, James Drury & Joel Prince of said county & State of the third part: With full power that the said William Prince do grant, bargain, & sell unto the said Wm S. Goodwyn the following property, a certain tract or parcel of land lying in said county of Southampton contain six hundred and one acres and bounded by the lands belonging to the estate of William Prince dec'd, Joel Harris (Deed Davis, and Randall's mill pond, which land was purchased by the said Wm Prince, at a sale made by Saml. Wells Shff. and admr. of William Prince dec'd under the said dec'd will, also all the slaves which the said Prince is entitled to in his father's estate which is yet undivided also covers all other interest which he holds in his father's estate. In trust to secure Saml. Drury, David Prince, James Drury, and Joel Prince against any loss for themselves and binding themselves, heirs & as security to the said William Prince in certain sums as below named due to Samuel Wells Shff and admr. of Wm Prince dec'd amounting to twenty eight hundred and thirty five dollars and fifty four cents with interest as stated, to wit: one bond due 17th June 1853, bearing date 17th day Decr 1852, Three other bonds of equal amount, say eight hundred dollars and sixty six cents each carrying interest from the 17th day Decr 1852, but not redeemable, say one on Decr 17 1853, one on 17 Decr 1854, the other on Decr 17 1855. Three last bonds being for the purchase of the above conveyed piece or tract of land. Now the said William do covenant and agree with the said security that so soon as any default is made in the payment of the said debts the said security becomes dissolved and wishes to be relieved from their liability as security, and make request the said Wm S. Goodwyn shall make sale of any or the whole of the conveyed property herein named to pay the said debts, interest and cost attending this deed or so much of any balance that may be due on said bonds and the surplus if any return to the said William Prince.
